About Tarren school

Tarren School is an independent special school for children and young people between the ages of eight and eighteen years who have a diagnosis of autistic spectrum disorder.

The school is situated in a semi-rural area in Neath Port Talbot. It is administered by Val's Place, a specialist children's services agency that has another independent special school in England.

Pupils who attend Tarren School are either residents in the linked children's home or live locally. There are currently seven pupils at the school. Most of these pupils are placed by local authorities in Wales.

The headteacher has been in post since the school was established in 2020.

Main findings

Strengths

Staff at the school know and understand their pupils well and provide them with valuable support during lessons. They have positive working relationships with pupils, which helps pupils to behave well and apply themselves to their work. Overall, pupils engage enthusiastically and enjoy their learning experiences. Over time, they develop trust in staff and show perseverance in their learning.

The school is developing a valuable culture of professional learning, which is helping staff to understand and support pupils' needs. For example, staff have visited practitioners in similar contexts to observe and discuss best practice, as well as participated in courses and worked collaboratively with external specialists.

Since the school opened, senior leaders and staff have responded positively to the recommendation for action from the initial registration visit to further develop the curriculum and assessment planning for secondary age pupils. The curriculum is tailored well to meet the needs and interests of these pupils, and helps them to plan for their future.

Recommended areas for action

The school should:

- ensure that pupils' targets from specialist therapeutic interventions are integrated appropriately in plans for teaching and learning
- further develop the outdoor area to provide a stronger focus on developing and supporting pupils' wellbeing and learning needs
- provide sufficient spaces for pupils to self-regulate away from other pupils
- further develop professional learning opportunities for all staff, including care staff from the home who provide additional support for pupils in education, to understand and provide for learners' specialist needs better
