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Outcome of follow-up visit relating to the Independent School Standards (Wales) Regulations 2003

At the core inspection in May 2022, the school did not comply with the following regulations:

- Standard 1: The quality of education provided by the school
- Standard 2: The spiritual, moral, social and cultural development of pupils
- Standard 3: The welfare, health and safety of the pupils
- Standard 7: The manner in which complaints are to be handled

Since the inspection, the school has improved the quality of education provided for pupils. The school has ensured that lessons are well planned, teachers now use effective teaching methods, plan suitable activities and manage class time wisely. Leaders have ensured that teachers have the appropriate knowledge and understanding of the subject matter being taught.

The school has strengthened the personal, social and health education provision. Staff now provide lessons which encourage pupils to behave responsibly, and enables them to distinguish right from wrong and to respect the law.

The school has prepared and implemented suitable policies to safeguard and promote the welfare of pupils and to promote good behaviour. Staff are deployed in such a way as to ensure the proper supervision of pupils. Leaders have ensured appropriate procedures for the management of complaints.

As a result, the school is judged to have met the requirements for standards 1,2, 3 and 7 of the Independent School Standards (Wales) Regulations 2003.
